Los Angeles, CA – Stuart Klapper, Managing Director for Autoliv Night Vision, talked to Lou Ann Hammond, CEO, www.drivingthenation.com, about Autoliv's newest technology.

Headquartered in Sweden, Autoliv is the largest safety supplier in the world. In 2013 Autoliv will introduce a Night Vision system that detects humans and animals uses infrared technology (far-infrared camera) and processes the images captured by the camera through Autoliv's electronic control unit. It is based on speed, steering angle and yaw rates gives the driver a warning and, or alert. Audi and Mercedes-Benz will be two of the first [car](#) [companies](#) to use this nighttime detection.

Klapper said that there are about 1.1 million animal accidents nationwide, causing about \$3.5 Billion worth of damage.
